Some facts that I gleaned: 10,000 people use the Parks and Rec. services each year. We have 19 acres of parks in TC. California average is 5 acres per 1,000 residents. Temple City is less than 1/2 acre per 1,000. The recreation program is mostly fee based and generates about \$700,000 per year. 500 children signed up for the 6 week swim program at TCHS. The Seniors go on 2 excursions per month. Star's Club started in the early 1990's together with the Super Stars. A wellness program will take place on Wednesdays. Shape-Up Temple City promotes healthy eating habits and exercise.

Cathy thanked our club for the support they have given through the years, donating money to expand Live Oak Park, the Performing Arts Pavilion, and play ground equipment.
